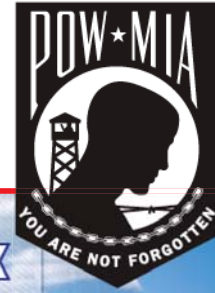

# POW / MIA NEWS

Updated August 2, 2016

**AMERICANS ACCOUNTED FOR:** The number of US personnel missing and unaccounted for from the Vietnam War is still **1,618**, unchanged since June 9<sup>th</sup>.

**PRESIDENT RAISES COMMITMENT TO POW/MIA ACCOUNTING AT DAV NATIONAL CONVENTION:** Speaking at the Disabled American Veterans 95<sup>th</sup> National Convention, President Obama stated, *"We've stood together at the Wall and remembered the lessons of Vietnam – that even when Americans may disagree about a war, we have to stand united in support of our troops. And that for mothers like Sara [Frances] Shay, who honored her missing son for more than 40 years, we will never stop working to bring home our prisoners of war and our missing in action. We leave nobody behind. No one."* The League appreciates the President's reference to America's longstanding commitment to achieve the accounting, though we also recognize fully that not all will be recovered, identified and returned to their families for honorable burial here in the United States.

**PRESIDENT TO VISIT LAOS FOR ASEAN LEADERS CONFERENCE:** In early September, the President will travel to Vientiane, Laos, for the ASEAN and East Asia Summits. Laos is serving as the 2016 Chair of ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations); therefore a series of meetings have been held in preparation with senior US officials, including Ben Rhodes, Deputy National Security Council (NSC) Advisor for Strategic Communications.

Most recently, **Secretary of State John Kerry** also was in Vientiane and, with US Ambassador to Laos Dan Clune, raised the need for positive Lao Government responses to specific requests to facilitate Joint Field Activities (JFAs). The two points relate to approval for US teams to base-camp at incident site locations to reduce travel time and costs for helicopter support (primarily blade hours), thus maximizing time available for recovery efforts, and an as-needed increase in the number of personnel allowed in-country simultaneously. Both are valid requests to help meet current budget requirements to do more with less in terms of funding and effectiveness, meaning results.

**US-LAO CONSULTATIONS NOW ONGOING:** A Lao Delegation is now in Hawaii meeting with DPAA and DIA officials related to future operations, hopefully including positive responses on the above requests. Deputy Director BG Mark S. Spindler, USA, will head the US Delegation and H. E. Khoanta Phalivong, Director General of Europe & Americas Department, Lao Ministry of Foreign Affairs, will head the Lao Delegation. Especially leading into the President's visit in early September, the League is hopeful that the Lao Government is receptive and responsive to these two requests that have now been raised bilaterally at the highest levels.

## Beaver County Veterans Treatment Court

A veteran from Beaver County will graduate from Veterans Treatment Court this month and another is scheduled to graduate in October. These are the

2nd and 3<sup>rd</sup> veterans to finish the program; seven additional veterans are currently in the program. So what is this all about?

The Beaver County Veterans Treatment Court (VTC) was established to address the needs of veterans who become involved in the criminal justice system. The mission of the VTC is to enhance public safety and reduce repeat offenses by veterans by connecting them with Veteran Justice Outreach programs, mental health treatment, drug and alcohol treatment and/or anger management treatment, and to find an appropriate disposition of the criminal charges by considering the defendant's treatment needs and the seriousness of the offense(s).

A Beaver County veteran who meets the following clinical criteria may request admission into the VTC Program: PTSD, traumatic brain injury (TBI), military sexual trauma, drug or alcohol addiction, diagnosis that includes, but is not limited to, depression or a psychological disorder requiring treatment and support, or special needs as recommended by the District Attorney.

A plea agreement is then recommended by the District Attorney and accepted by the Veterans Treatment Court. The veteran must voluntarily agree to participate in and be subject to the rules, guidelines and sanctions of the Veterans Treatment Court Program.

A key component of the success is the Veteran Mentor Program. A veteran mentor is paired with a veteran participant to provide support as the veteran navigates through the court system and treatment. Ideally, mentors will be paired by branch of service whenever possible. Shared experiences of another veteran are critical in

A veteran who has entered a plea and has been accepted into the Program will be assigned a mentor at the time of his/her plea based on availability of mentors. We currently have nine active VVA mentors who are doing an exceptional job for the nine veterans currently on the program. They are listed below. Obviously, we need additional mentors if we are to expand the program. Please consider helping our fellow veterans, after all, isn't that our principle purpose: "Never again will one generation of veterans abandon another." It is not a time consuming task and is very rewarding. Please contact me anytime and help another veteran.

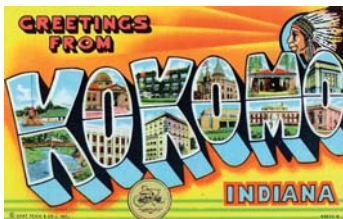
